ON THE FIRE FRONT

NE may fear that the Captain had something to do with the call-outs on the Monday 31 Jan and Tuesday 1 Feb, after sending out an email prompting members to be alert and check your pager batteries for that coming week.

Two fires at Ebenezer originated from the same property on Sackville Road.

Monday's fire started when a car was being driven around a paddock and something between the car, a dry grassy paddock and 40 degree heat lead to a fire breaking out.

Six Cat.1 tankers were able to contain the 3 hectare fire but the car and a backhoe were destroyed.

Tuesday's conditions were worse than Monday and a TOBAN was in place.

The hot NW winds re-ignited the fire from Monday and this fire really got a run on and threatened numerous properties on Sackville Road, Tizzana Road and Prentis Lane.

We were involved in property protection at Taylors mushroom farm on Sackville Road.

By the day's end 14 fire tankers and four helicopters, including the Erickson Sky Crane, were used to suppress this fire.

Luckily the remainder of the week was fire free despite the extreme heat.

Only a few minor calls since have been attended by members, including a tree down on Creek Ridge Road.

We were also lucky to avoid a major bushfire in our area when on the Tuesday of the Ebenezer fire, a fire broke out on Old East Kurrajong Road near Creek Ridge Road, and had the potential to run into our area but was caught by four brigades before it became too big.

Crew member turn-outs have been very good, including the crews during the working week.

It was great to see Gary Adams back on the truck for the Ebenezer call after a long stint out with a knee operation.

CHRISTINE RUTTER


Chris joined the East Kurrajong Rural Fire Brigade in August of 1991.

Whilst researching info for the upcoming book on the Brigades history, a number of old photos have been dug out of the archives


and a few of them have been placed on the Brigade website www.frrfb.org.au. Some of these photos are out of the late 1970's and the others are from 1991.
